# FRIDAY HEADLINE CONCERT: Natalie MacMaster & Donnell Leahy

The entertainment world is filled with extraordinary stories. But few match the beguiling true-life tale of Canada's reigning couple of Celtic music.

**Natalie MacMaster** could be called one of Cape Breton, Nova Scotia's most important exports: a virtuosic traditional fiddler and brilliant step-dancer.

Her husband **Donnell Leahy** is just as amazing; his music synthesizes traditional influences with more contemporary Celtic/folk sensibilities.

### with special guest **Poor Man's Gambit**

This young trio from the Philadelphia folk scene has already been called "a treasure chest of traditional." Their repertoire is mainly from Ireland but also from England, Brittany and Scotland.

**Corey Purcell** is a world-class Irish dancer and a multi-instrumentalist, contributing button accordion,

cittern, bodhran and vocals. Fiddler and singer **Dierdre Lockman** has been pursuing her passion for Irish music and dance since the age of four, and has competed in step dance at the national level. **Joseph Carmichael** is known for his unique and jazzy approach to accompaniment within the Celtic and folk genres. In addition to guitar and vocals, Joseph also plays whistle and flute.

# **FRIDAY CONTRA DANCE:** Music by The Contra Rebels

Featuring Todd Clewell, Barb Schmid and Henry Koretzky, this old-time southern-style band has been a fixture on Central PA's music scene for decades, and plays for dances from New York to Georgia.

# with caller Bob Nicholson

Bob, a veteran caller from Syracuse, New York, is totally focused on fun, accessible dances. The *Wilkes-Barre Times Leader* says, "He has a gift for teaching beginners how to engage in this gentle but lively, traditional form of dancing."

# SATURDAY MATINÉE: **Hubby Jenkins**

A talented multi-instrumental roots artist following the thread of African American history that weaves itself through country blues, ragtime, fiddle and banjo, and traditional jazz. Formerly with the Carolina Chocolate Drops!

Born and raised in Brooklyn, Hubby developed his guitar and vocal craft busking in New York City, delving into his Southern roots and performing material by venerable artists. An ambitiously

itinerant musician, he took his show on the road, playing the streets, coffee shops, bars, and house parties of cities around the U.S. He was an integral part of the GRAMMY award winning band Carolina Chocolate Drops (2010 - 2016), as well as a member of Rhiannon Giddens band. Today he spreads his knowledge and love of old-time American music and history through his dynamic solo performances.

### **SUNDAY MATINÉE:** Larry & Joe

A surprising fusion of Venezuelan and Appalachian folk music on harp, banjo, cuatro, fiddle, maracas, guitar, upright bass, and whatever else these two master musicians decide to throw in the van.

These two versatile multi-instrumentalists and singer-songwriters are on a mission to dismantle barriers and build bridges between their different folk traditions.

Larry Bellorín hails from Monagas, Venezuela and is a legend of Llanera music. Joe Troop is from North Carolina and is a GRAMMY-nominated bluegrass and old-time musician. The pandemic brought them together: Joe's acclaimed "latingrass" band Che Apalache forced into hiatus; Larry in exile, working construction to makeends meet. As a duo, they present a distinct blend of their musical inheritances and traditions as well as storytelling about the ways that music and social movements coalesce.

#### Ian Zolitor, emcee

Ian is the host of WXPN radio's Folk Show, broadcast from Philadelphia on Sunday nights from 8 to 10 pm. Gene Shay, Ian's mentor and previous host of the Folk Show, savs: "He's going to be somebody very special to the music scene."



# SATURDAY HEADLINE CONCERT: Hot Club of Cowtown

This trio's exuberant alchemy of hot jazz, Texas swing, quirky humor and wicked improvisation has won hearts all over the world. Currently based in Austin, Texas, the Hot Club of Cowtown mixes **Elana James**' groovy fiddling, **Whit Smith**'s jazzy guitar work, and **Jake Erwin**'s mischievous slapping bass. The band has toured extensively worldwide for over 25 years, both on its own and with artists from Bob Dylan to Willie Nelson to the Squirrel Nut Zippers. Career highlights include performing at the grand opening of the Country Music Hall of Fame &

This Boston-based band pushes the boundaries of the Southern American style, with influences ranging from Celtic to African-rooted rhythm & blues to Cajun. Since all the musicians are also dancers, they understand how to use melody, rhythm and dynamics to enhance each particular dance.

### with caller Janine Smith

Cross a howdy-ma'am-BBQ-and-beans honky tonk with Zoom contra, and sprinkle on some twinkly lights for sass, and you get The Janine Smith Experience! She'll bring you a night of fun dances, from squares to contras, whether you're sitting, standing, or somewhere in between. Her teaching is clear and to-the-point, though she has been known to goof around a bit. She's a founding member of the DC Square Dance Collective.

### SUNDAY HEADLINE CONCERT: The Klezmatics

Joyously unconventional Eastern European Jewish music, steeped in tradition and spirituality while incorporating contemporary lyrical themes, world rhythms, jazz and punk in a mix that's wild, mystical, provocative, reflective, and ecstatically danceable.

In their 35 years, the Klezmatics have raised the bar for Eastern European Jewish music. Often called a "Jewish roots band," the Klezmatics have led a popular revival of this ages-old, nearly forgotten art form. They've created a catalog that is aesthetically, politically and musically interesting. They've inspired

future generations, and helped to change the face of contemporary Yiddish culture. Not bad for a bunch of Americans who each came to klezmer music almost by accident!

### Music by Chelsea Reed and the Fair Weather Five

Silly, passionate people who love playing this music: that's all there is to it! Since the fateful day Chelsea invited five friends to play some tunes in a South Philly dining room, she's been living the dream of singing her favorite songs for audiences that love the music of Bessie Smith and Billie Holiday as much as she does. They draw upon the intensity of powerhouse vocalists, the ingenuity of 20th century composers, and the soul of the dance floor.

The Rhythm Lounge specializes in bringing more dance and music events to the Central Pennsylvania area, from vintage jazz-era dances like the Lindy Hop to art forms like Balboa and African dance. People can gather to learn, practice, and celebrate dance classes, social dances, and special events.

















### Emerging Artist Showcase SATURDAY, 12:20 to 3:20 pm - five of your new favorite acts!

With a focus on American roots/folk music, singer-songwriter **Joseph Alton Miller** strives to bridge the gap separating the many genres that make up the American sound. He has been recording and touring for almost two decades as a solo artist, sharing stages with acts such as Brandi Carlile, Living Color, Railroad Earth, and Richard Shindell (Cry, Cry, Cry).

**Dann Pell** is a singer-songwriter and fingerstyle guitarist from Chester County, PA who makes meditative folk music in the spirit of Bob Dylan and Iron & Wine, with an occasional psychedelic flare reminiscent of Steve Gunn and Kurt Vile.

**The Honey Badgers** are known for their sparkling harmonies, honest lyrics, and undeniable chemistry on and off stage. Weaving their voices together with Michael's driving guitar and Erin's wistful violin, they spin stories and songs about finding yourself, finding each other, and finding your way in the world. They were recently voted #1 "Most Wanted" at Falcon Ridge Folk Festival Emerging Artist Showcase 2023.

**Erin Lunsford** is an award-winning singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist (guitar, banjo, piano) originally from Fincastle, VA and now located in Richmond, VA. Best known as the front-woman, lead vocalist and lyricist in touring indie-pop/soul band Erin & The Wildfire, her vocals have been described as soulful, expressive, and powerhouse.

**Red Smith and Blue Dawn** rise to the occasion! Red Smith is a powerful vocalist and songwriter with a driving guitar to match. Supporting trio Blue Dawn is Shelly Monroe on bass, Matt Zuckerman on dobro, and Joe Perloff on mandolin. This group blurs genre lines, channeling traditional bluegrass, country, rock n roll, folk and blues all with a unique spin.
